



Paediatric Feeding: Putting Theory into Practice

1 Day Workshop – Monday 17th February 2020

A practical workshop for Speech Pathologists working with children with feeding difficulties. Holly Tickner will be presenting a full day of case studies, video footage, therapy planning and resources to allow you to work confidently with your paediatric feeding caseload. The focus of the day's content will be on *how* to apply evidence-based practice in a clinical setting, that can be tailored to suit each client's needs and achieve successful outcomes.

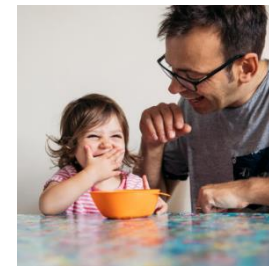
Content covered will suit a variety of caseloads including; restricted diets, early intervention, reflux, food allergies, anxiety, medical trauma, disability, fussy/picky eating, and delayed or disordered oral motor feeding skills. Infant to adolescent age-groups will be discussed.

Workshop Objectives

- ☑ Consolidate your assessment skills across a variety of clinical presentations, across age groups
- ☑ Critical analysis of different feeding therapy programs and approaches, and how this applies to a clinical setting (eg SOS, Food Chaining, DoR, STEPS, OM-based approaches)
- ☑ Develop skill and knowledge in how to interpret assessment results to develop therapy goals with measurable outcomes, within a framework of family centredness
- ☑ Develop skill and knowledge in using a variety of therapeutic strategies to conduct therapy sessions



This workshop is designed for Speech Pathologists who are working at beginner and intermediate levels. A current paediatric feeding caseload is recommended but not essential. Registration fee includes handouts, resources, lunch and refreshments. On the day there will be the opportunity to subscribe to additional resources & support.
